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Seven new species of *Trichostema* (Lamiaceae: Ajugoideae) from the North American Coastal Plain biodiversity hotspot

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Abstract

Trichostema section *Trichostema* occurs in the North American Coastal Plain biodiversity hotspot. Much of the previously noted morphological diversity in this section has so far gone unstudied. A combination of extensive field studies, principal components analyses and statistical tests on morphological data, common garden experiments, nextRAD sequencing, and Bayesian phylogenetic techniques was used to discover and describe taxonomic entities. The Bayesian phylogeny resolved strongly supported clades that mirrored the morphological, ecological, and geographic findings. Given the preponderance of the data, seven new taxa are described herein at species level.

Introduction

Trichostema Gronov. in Linnaeus (1753: 598) is a genus of mints (Lamiaceae) endemic to North America that are largely xeric specialists. This genus has traditionally been split into five sections based on morphology, life history, and chromosome number (Lewis 1945; Lewis 1960). The type section of Trichostema, section Trichostema, currently includes four species: Trichostema dichotomum Linnaeus (1753: 598), T. setaceum Houttuyn (1778: 428-429), T. suffrutescens Kearney (1894: 483), and T. nesophilum K. S. McClelland and Weakley (2019: 109-110). All four species occur in a recently recognized biodiversity hotspot: the North American Coastal Plain (Noss et al. 2015). The xeric landscapes of Florida in particular have been shaped by millions of years of dynamic geologic change resulting in a high number of endemic taxa (Christman & Judd 1990; Deyrup 1989; Sorrie & Weakley 2001) and distinct biogeographic patterns (Soltis et al. 2006; Sorrie & Weakley 2001), as observed in a few other areas of the world under similar geological and climatic conditions (e.g. Casella et al. 2023; Perrino et al. 2022; Perrino et al. 2013; Wulff et al. 2013; Ozkan and Suel 2008). The ridge systems of peninsular Florida have provided isolated xeric habitats where speciation can and has occurred, for example in Dicerandra Bentham in Lindley (1830; Huck et al. 1989; Oliviera et al. 2007), Conradina A. Gray (1870: 294-295; Edwards et al. 2006), and Polygonella Michaux (1803: 240-241; Schuster et al. 2011). Trichostema section Trichostema also shows this pattern of diversity, with morphologically and ecologically distinct entities occurring on various xeric ridges of the peninsula and on the barrier island chains (McClelland 2022).

Lewis (1945, 1960) and Huang *et al.* (2008) represent the only whole-genus studies of *Trichostema* since Bentham (1835). Lewis' investigations involved thorough morphological and cytological studies but occurred before genetic data were available. Huang *et al.* (2008) focused on the nuclear "barcode" genes ITS 1-5.8S-ITS 2, the chloroplast "barcode" gene ndhF, and morphology to build their phylogenies using maximum parsimony analyses. The present study combines the morphological rigor of Lewis' (1945) study with more recent sequencing and statistical modeling techniques than were used in Huang *et al.* (2008). Thus, a multi-pronged approach to species delimitation was used for studying *Trichostema* sect. *Trichostema* following the guidelines put forward by Poindexter (2019). Multiple lines

of evidence were utilized to assess the morphological, ecological, cytological, and genetic diversity present in section *Trichostema*. The concepts of *Trichostema* sp. 02 (Weakley 2005) and the *T. suffrutescens* with "exceptionally narrow leaves" (Lewis 1945) were further explored. Extensive field studies found five additional taxonomic entities. The majority of these are associated with ridge or island systems of Florida or the Gulf Coast. A review of published names in section *Trichostema* (McClelland 2022) showed all previously published names were based on type specimens that fall within the species concept of one of the four currently recognized species. Thus, new names are provided for usage going forward, including in the Flora of North America and Flora of the Southeastern United States (Weakley *et al.* 2023). Additional details of monographic work are available in McClelland (2022).

Materials and methods

Habitat data, voucher specimens, seeds, and leaf tissue were collected from 167 sites in Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Mississippi, North Carolina, and South Carolina. Habitats were described using the *Guide to the Natural Communities of Florida* (Florida Natural Areas Inventory 2010). All vouchers have at least one herbarium sheet deposited at the University of North Carolina Herbarium (NCU) with a subset also having leaf tissue preserved in silica gel at the North Carolina Botanical Garden (NCBG). Fruits were placed in resealable plastic bags for storage. Leaves for genetic analysis were preserved using silica gel in resealable plastic bags. Fruits and leaf tissue remaining after the study was complete were deposited at NCBG.

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


FIGURE 1. Detail of the stem and node trichomes of *Trichostema* section *Trichostema*. A) *Trichostema dichotomum*, B) *T. setaceum*, C) *T. suffrutescens*, D) *T. nesophilum*, E) *T. floridanum*, F) *T. fruticosum*, G) *T. bridgesii-orzellii*, H) *T. gracile*, I) *T. hobe*, J) *T. microphyllum*. Photos by R. Kevan Schoonover McClelland.




FIGURE 2. Detail of the nutlets of *Trichostema* section *Trichostema*. A) *Trichostema dichotomum*, B) *T. setaceum*, C) *T. suffrutescens*, D) *T. nesophilum*, E) *T. floridanum*, F) *T. fruticosum*, G) *T. latens*, H) *T. bridgesii-orzellii*, I) *T. gracile*, J) *T. hobe*, K) *T. microphyllum*. *Trichostema dichotomum* (A) shows large alveoli and tall ridges. *T. latens* (G) shows small alveoli and shorter ridges. Photos by Derick Poindexter.

Quantitative and qualitative morphological data were collected from 913 herbarium specimens covering the four currently recognized species in section Trichostema and the seven additional taxonomic entities (Table 1). Quantitative characters were measured using a dissecting microscope and a micrometer (2018–2020) or a digital caliper (2020–2021). Qualitative characters were coded as presence/absence and included branching pattern (defined as having primary branching occurring at the base, middle, or upper part of the plant); the type (defined as upwardly curved, spreading, or downwardly curved; Figure 1) and length (defined by cell number) of trichomes, glandular and eglandular, on the stem; type and length of trichomes at the nodes (defined like the stem trichomes); type and length of trichomes, glandular and eglandular, in the inflorescence branches (defined like the stem trichomes); shape of the leaf (defined as widest toward the base, near the middle, or towards the apex), leaf apex (defined as acute, $\pm 90^{\circ}$, obtuse, rounded, or emarginate), and leaf base (defined as cuneate, rounded, or attenuate); shape of the bract, bract apex, and bract base (all defined like the leaves); branching pattern of the style (the style in *Trichostema* is bifid and the ratio of the relative lengths of the two branches ranges from 1:1 to 1:10); and ornamentation of the mature nutlets (the nutlets of Trichostema are rugose with ridges and alveoli; ornamentation was defined by relative size of the ridges [short, mid-sized, or tall] and alveoli [small, mid-sized, or large]; Figure 2). Character data were summarized in Microsoft Excel (Microsoft 2016) and by using R v4.1.2 (R Core Team 2021) utilizing RStudio v2022.02.3 (RStudio Team 2022). Averages and standard deviations were calculated using Microsoft Excel. Data were visualized using ggplot2 (Wickham 2016) and factoextra (Kassambara and Mundt 2020) in R. Dunn's tests were employed with significant results being further analyzed using Kruskal-Wallis rank-sum tests with a Bonferroni correction in the dunn.test package (Dinno 2017). Principal components analyses (PCAs) were performed using prcomp in stats (R Core Team 2021) and visualized using fviz functions in factoextra (Kassambara and Mundt 2020).

Date of flowering from 1626 herbarium specimens, collected vouchers, and 2168 verified observations from iNaturalist were recorded as year-day offset by three months (i.e., 1 March=1; 28 February=365). Flowering time was visualized using ggplot2 (Wickham 2016). Seeds were sown in a mixture of peat, sand, and perlite, and germinated in a

climate-controlled greenhouse. Young cymes/verticils were collected from flowering individuals in the greenhouse and fixed in Carnoy I (1 part glacial acetic acid : 3 parts 95% ethanol) solution for 24 hours. These were then transferred to 70% ethanol and stored in a -20°C freezer for long-term storage. To perform the chromosome squash, anthers were extracted from *ca*. three flowers at a time, stained with acetocarmine using an oxidized iron needle probe to intensify staining, and squashed in Hoyer's mounting medium. Multiple cells at metaphase were then isolated with a trinocular Leica phase contrast microscope at 1000x magnification and chromosomes were counted by sight.

DNA extractions were performed on leaf tissue samples from silica dried leaf samples, herbarium specimens, and greenhouse plants using a modified Qiagen DNeasy protocol (Poindexter 2019). These DNA samples were sent to SNPsaurus for nextRAD processing following Russello *et al.* (2015). Genomic DNA was fragmented with Nextera reagent (Illumina, Inc.) and then amplified using selective PCR primers. The genotyping analysis used custom scripts (SNPsaurus, LLC) that created a de novo reference from abundant reads present more than 65 times across the combined set of samples, and then mapping all the reads to the reference with an alignment identity threshold of 90% (BBMap, http://sourceforge.net/projects/bbmap/). Genotyping was done using Samtools and bcftools (samtools mpileup -gu -Q 10 -t DP,DPR -f ref_trichostema.fasta -b sample_list | bcftools call – cv -> trichostema.vcf) and loci filtered with vcftools. The PHYLIP format file was generated by concatenating the full-length loci sequence and then editing in genotype calls for each sample. Samples with fewer than 1 million high quality reads were removed from the alignment prior to phylogenetic analyses.

Phylogenetic analyses were run on the resulting alignment using BEAST v2.7.4 and associated software (Bouckaert *et al.* 2019) using a strict clock with mean clock rate of one and Yule model with birth rate prior set to the default value. The substitution model and mutation rate were estimated with the use of bModelTest (Bouckaert & Drummond 2017) with the proportion of invariable sites, rates, frequencies, and gamma shape priors all kept at their default settings. Based on preliminary runs, a pre-burn in of 2,500,000 generations was used since it consistently took the model 1,500,000 to 2,000,000 generations to reach an initial state of stationarity. After the pre-burn in, the model ran for 100,000,000 generations sampling after every 1000. A maximum clade credibility (MCC) tree was constructed from the resulting 100,001 trees using TreeAnnotator with 10% burn in and visualized and annotated using FigTree v1.4.3 (Rambaut 2016).






FIGURE 3. PCAs with greatest separation among the 95% confidence ellipses. The top ten contributors to the PCA are shown as arrows. A) PCA using all species and the "all characters no style" dataset with datapoints colored by species complex. B) PCA using the species from the *Trichostema dichotomum* complex and the "all characters no style" dataset with datapoints colored by species. C) PCA using the species from the *Trichostema setaceum* complex and the "all characters no style" dataset with datapoints colored by species. D) PCA using the species from the *Trichostema setaceum* complex and the "all characters no style" dataset with datapoints colored by species. D) PCA using the species from the *Trichostema suffrutescens* complex and the "all characters no style" dataset with datapoints colored by species.

Results

The field work data suggested the presence of eleven distinct taxonomic entities in *Trichostema* section *Trichostema* identifiable by morphology, ecology, geographic range, and phenology. We base our concept of "distinct taxonomic entities" on the combined and synthesized application of all available evidence—morphology, gene sequences, habitat, phenology, and biogeography. Four of these entities corresponded to the four currently recognized species in this section. Significance tests showed significant differences among most species in all quantitative characters analyzed (McClelland 2022). Moderate morphological separation was found among species using PCAs (Figure 3). These differences were often found in the orientation and size of stem trichomes (Figure 1) and the ornamentation of the nutlets (Figure 2).

Overall, every species had the largest number of flowering observations in the late summer through the fall with the southernmost species having their flowering times extend into the winter months (Figure 4). Several species also had occurrences of flowering in late winter and spring (March to May). Based on field observations, these early flowering events are not as prolific as the main fall flowering. While overlap exists in the flowering times of all species, those species not blooming year-round are offset by a few weeks from the other species in their complex, including locally co-occurring, sympatric, and parapatric populations.





Plants in the common garden maintained their morphological distinctions. The first sets of leaves of all entities were abnormally large and some were crenate or lobed, likely due to the reduction of UV light in the greenhouse because of its tinted windows. Later leaves reverted closer to wild-type size and shape. A base chromosome number of n=19 was determined for three species.




FIGURE 5. MCC Phylogeny of *Trichostema* section *Trichostema*. Species are highlighted using hashed boxes. Branch PP values are 1 unless otherwise provided. *Trichostema coeruleum* and members of sections *Chromocephalum* and *Orthopodium* are used as outgroups.

The BEAST analysis provided robust support for the monophyly of section *Trichostema* (posterior probability [PP] = 1; Figure 5). Each taxonomic entity recognized from field data and morphological studies formed a strongly supported clade (PP = 1) in the genetic analysis, with one exception (Figure 5). An important result from the phylogeny was that the genetic data clarified the taxonomic identity of several populations. When vouchers from these populations were reassigned in the morphological analyses, it resulted in increased separation in the PCAs and greater significance in the significance tests. Furthermore, individuals from two sympatric and five parapatric populations of the taxonomic

entities were sampled for the genetic analysis. There were no intermediate plants seen at any of these sites and all sampled individuals formed clades with individuals sharing morphological and ecological similarities rather than the sympatric or parapatric taxon/a. The congruence among the morphological, ecological, geographical, and genetic data supports the recognition of these taxonomic entities as species following the general lineage concept and other modern species concepts (de Quieroz 1998).

Taxonomic treatment

Notes on treatments:—Characters were measured from herbarium specimens with the exception of plant height, overall plant habit, and flower color, which were documented from field sites and iNaturalist observations. Quantitative characters are reported as "(minimum measured value–)average minus one standard deviation–average plus one standard deviation(–maximum measured value)" followed by the average. Qualitative character traits were included in the species description only if they were present on more than five percent of measured specimens. Qualitative characters that occurred on 33%–66% of specimens are defined as "occasional" and those that occurred on 5%–33% of specimens are defined as "rare." If multiple character states for a qualitative character are provided (*e.g.*, "leaf apices acute, occasionally \pm 90° or obtuse"), the first character state listed is the most common on the specimens measured. Exceptions to this are the colors of buds, open petals, and anthers, which are listed from darkest to lightest colors. *Trichostema floridanum* K. S. McClell. and Weakley, *sp. nov.* (Figures 6 and 7)

Diagnosis:—Compact bushy perennial to 1 m tall, morphologically most similar to *Trichostema dichotomum*. It differs from *T. dichotomum* by being a short-lived perennial (*vs.* annual), its shorter leaves of 1.65–3.28 cm long (*vs.* 2.58–4.78 cm), smaller leaf length/width ratio of 2.4–3.63 times long as wide (*vs.* 3.38–4.92), lack of spreading trichomes more than 6–7 cells long on the stems and at nodes (*vs.* presence of spreading trichomes more than 6–7 cells long on the stems and at nodes; Figure 1), nutlets with short ridges and small to mid-sized alveoli (*vs.* mid-sized to tall ridges and mid-sized to large alveoli; Figure 2), year-long flowering time (*vs.* July–November), and restriction to calcareous coastal or near coastal habitats (*vs.* generalist on semi-mesic to semi-xeric substrates).

Type:—U.S.A. Florida. St. Lucie County. Openings in coastal strand/hammock, Fort Pierce Inlet State Park. Along main road through park and around headquarters parking lot, 27.474711°N, 80.294661°W, 5 August 2017, *R. Kevan Schoonover, II, and Robert K. Schoonover 93a–l* (holotype NCU!; isotypes F!, FLAS!, K!, GH!, MO!, NCU!, NY!, P!, UC!, US!, USF!). Note: Specimens *R. Kevan Schoonover, II, 93a–l* represent a single gathering in accordance with Article 8.2 of the ICN (Turland *et al.* 2018).

Bushy perennial to 1 m tall; branching throughout the plant; stem hairs downwardly curved, rarely spreading to three, rarely to six, cells long (Figure 1e), with sessile glands and occasionally stalked glands to two cells long, rarely to three cells long (including gland); node hairs spreading, rarely downwardly curved, to four, rarely to six, cells long (Figure 1e); leaves widest towards the base, occasionally widest near the middle or towards the tip, $(1.1-)1.65-3.28(-4.9) \times (0.41-)0.56-1.11(-2)$, average of 2.46×0.83 cm, (1.85-)2.4-3.63(-5), average of 3.01, times long as wide, base cuneate to attenuate, margin entire, apex obtuse, rarely rounded, acute, or $\pm 90^{\circ}$; inflorescence hairs spreading to upwardly curved, to three, rarely to four, cells long, with sessile and spreading glands to two, rarely to three, cells long (including gland); bracts widest towards the tip, occasionally widest near the middle, rarely widest towards the base, rarely falcate, $(2.8-)4.6-8.31(-14.1) \times (0.5-)1.01-2.26(-3.8)$, average of 6.45×1.64 , mm, (2.04-)3.1-5.28(-9.6), average of 4.19, times long as wide, base cuneate to attenuate, margin entire, apex acute, rarely $\pm 90^{\circ}$; fruiting calyx (5.1-)5.72-6.74(-7.5), average of 6.23, mm long; buds dark blue-purple to light blue-purple, corolla dark to light blue or blue-purple; style bifd, the longer arm 1-2 times as long as the shorter; mature nutlets alveolate, (1.2-)1.61-1.91(-2.2), average of 1.76, mm long, hilum (0.4-)0.46-0.63(-0.8), average of 0.55, mm long, (0.21-)0.27-0.36(-0.44), average of 0.31, times the length of the nutlet, alveoli small, occasionally mid-sized, ridges short, occasionally mid-sized (Figure 2e); 2n = 38.

Phenology:-Flowers and fruits all year.

Etymology:—The epithet *floridanum* (Latinization of the place name Florida) is given to this species because of its restricted range: all populations of this species occur in Florida except for a single known population on the island of Grand Bahama. The common name Florida coastal Bluecurls is given to this species for the same reasons.




FIGURE 8. Approximate range of Trichostema floridanum based on field data and herbarium records.

Habitat and distribution:—*Trichostema floridanum* occurs in various open, calcareous environments in coastal and near coastal localities along the Florida peninsula (Figure 8). Some examples from barrier islands are openings in coastal strand, maritime hammock, shell mounds, and more protected areas of coastal grasslands. Near coastal examples are pine rockland, roadsides bedded with shell, and Florida scrub with calcareous influences.

Conservation status:—This species faces similar threats to *T. nesophilum* as they occupy very similar habitats. Hurricanes, rising sea levels, and increased urbanization of the coastline all threaten this species and its narrow range. Fortunately, there are many protected lands that hold sizeable populations of this species and it is very common in its range. Based on the data collected for this study, this species should be recognized at a G3 ranking (NatureServe 2020).

Trichostema fruticosum K. S. McClell., sp. nov. (Figures 9 and 10)

- **Diagnosis:**—Compact to diffuse bushy perennial to 1.25 m tall, morphologically most similar to *Trichostema dichotomum*. It differs from *T. dichotomum* by being a short-lived perennial (*vs.* annual), its wider leaves of 0.74–1.6 cm (*vs.* 0.59–1.25 cm), smaller leaf length/ width ratio of 2.89–4.42 times long as wide (*vs.* 3.38–4.92), lack of spreading trichomes more than 6–7 cells long on the stems and at nodes, (*vs.* presence of spreading trichomes more than 6–7 cells long on the stems and at nodes; Figure 1), nutlets with short to mid-sized ridges and small to mid-sized alveoli (*vs.* mid-sized to tall ridges and mid-sized to large alveoli; Figure 2), and year-long flowering time (*vs.* July–November).

Kevan Schoonover McClelland 222a–w* represent a single gathering in accordance with Article 8.2 of the ICN (Turland *et al.* 2018). Mockernut Hill Botanical Garden is a botanical garden oriented around land management training, showcasing trails through exemplary native vegetation rather than display gardens. The sampled population is one of many naturally occurring on the property and not of a horticultural origin.

Bushy perennial to 1.25 m tall; branching throughout the plant; stem hairs downwardly curved, occasionally spreading to three, rarely to five, cells long (Figure 1f), with sessile and stalked glands to two cells long, rarely to three cells long (including gland); node hairs spreading, rarely downwardly curved, to four, rarely to six, cells long (Figure 1f); leaves widest towards the base, occasionally widest near the middle, rarely widest towards the tip, $(1.6-)2.82-5.4(-7.4) \times (0.33-)0.74-1.6(-2.6)$, average of 4.11×1.17 , cm, (2.19-)2.89-4.42(-6.06), average of 3.65, times long as wide, base cuneate to attenuate, margin entire, apex obtuse, occasionally $\pm 90^{\circ}$, rarely acute or rounded; inflorescence hairs spreading to upwardly curved, to three cells long, with sessile and spreading glands to two, rarely to three, cells long (including gland); bracts widest towards the tip or near the middle, rarely widest towards the base, rarely falcate $(3.9-)6.41-12.03(-16.6) \times (0.7-)1.21-2.71(-4.6)$, average of 9.22×1.96 , mm, (2.65-)3.55-6.41(-11.3), average of 4.98, times long as wide, base cuneate to attenuate, margin entire, apex acute, rarely acuminate; fruiting calyx (5.6-)6.24-7.65(-9.2), average of 6.94, mm long; buds dark blue-purple to light blue-purple, corolla dark to light blue or

blue-purple; anthers dark to light blue or blue-purple; style bifid, the longer arm 1-1.5, occasionally 2, times as long as the shorter; mature nutlets alveolate, (1.5-)1.71-2.06(-2.3), average of 1.88, mm long, hilum (0.4-)0.51-0.69(-0.9), average of 0.6, mm long, (0.24-)0.28-0.36(-0.44), average of 0.32, times the length of the nutlet, alveoli small to midsized, rarely large, ridges short, occasionally mid-sized (Figure 2f).

Phenology:—Flowers and fruits April to December. Some plants will have a small number of flowers January to March.

Etymology:—The epithet *fruticosum* (Latin, bushy) is given to this species based on its growth habit. It often has a woody base and forms a relatively large, much branched "bush" (to 1.25 m tall) compared to the typically smaller, more compact growth forms of *T. floridanum* and *T. nesophilum* and the more virgate branching of the members of the *T. suffrutescens* complex. The common name given to this species is Bushy Bluecurls. This is derived from the same feature as the specific epithet. The common name was suggested by Linda Duever, founder of Mockernut Hill Botanical Garden and co-collector of the type specimens.

Habitat and distribution:—*Trichostema fruticosum* occurs in openings in a variety of mesic to semi-dry habitats with or without calcareous influences on the mainland and some barrier islands; 0–100 meters; USA: Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Mississippi. (Figure 11).

Conservation status:—*Trichostema fruticosum*, while having a more restricted range than *T. dichotomum*, is much more widespread than *T. floridanum* and *T. nesophilum*, most likely due to its habitat tolerances. It is common throughout its range, and it has also been introduced to the nursery trade under the species name of *T. dichotomum*. Although it is widespread, many of its populations are coastal or near coastal and under threat from rising sea levels and hurricanes. Based on the data collected for this study, this species should be recognized at a G3 ranking (NatureServe 2020). Most of the populations of this species occur in Florida and thus it was calculated to have an S3 ranking in Florida. The smaller numbers of populations in Alabama, Georgia, and Mississippi led those states having an S2 rank calculated for this species (NatureServe 2020).

Notes:—*Trichostema fruticosum* was the only species not to form a clade in the BEAST analysis (Figure 5). The sample from Estero Bay (EstBPu) is sister to the clade containing *T. floridanum* and *T. nesophilum* and the sample from Mississippi (NCU 667421) diverges at the base of the perennial *T. dichotomum* complex clade in the MCC tree.

The reason for the incongruence in the placement of the Estero Bay specimen is likely due to its low number of high-quality reads mapped to the reference. This would explain why this specimen, which is geographically and morphologically distinct from *T. nesophilum*, is not in the clade with the rest of *T. fruticosum*. Thus, it is possible that the missing data would have aligned this specimen with the larger clade. This sample, though, based on its morphology, ecology, and biogeography still falls within the concept of *T. fruticosum*.

The Mississippi sample poses a different issue. Unlike the Estero Bay sample, this sample had a high number of high-quality reads mapped to the reference . However, like the Estero Bay specimen, this specimen was collected at the edge of the species range, this time at the far western edge. It could be that this specimen represents a separate taxon. If this were true, its potential extent is west of the Tombigee River and Mobile Bay, with the *T. fruticosum-T. floridanum-T. nesophilum* clade all occuring east of that demarcating line, a biogeographic pattern shown in other taxa (Soltis *et al.* 2006). Larger amounts of sampling would be needed to determine this. If it is recognized as a separate taxon, it would likely be morphologically cryptic relative to *T. fruticosum.* To increase taxonomic and nomenclatural stability, the type specimen for this species was selected from a population that always fell within the strongly supported clade of *T. fruticosum* near the center of the species' range.

- Diagnosis:—Herbaceous to woody annual to 50 cm tall, morphologically most similar to *Trichostema dichotomum*. It differs from *T. dichotomum* by its oblong to oblanceolate leaves (vs. lanceolate to elliptic), obtuse to emarginate leaf apices (vs. acute to obtuse), shorter fruiting calyces of 5.44–5.89 mm (vs. 5.91–7.24 mm), style branch ratio of 1:2–1:4 (vs. 1:1–1:2), and shorter mature nutlets of 1.61–1.77 mm (vs. 1.75–2.16 mm) with small alveoli (vs. mid-sized to large alveoli; Figure 2).

Herbaceous to woody annual to 50 cm tall; branching primarily in the middle to upper part of the plant; stem hairs downwardly curved, rarely spreading to two, occasionally to three, cells long; leaves widest towards the tip or near the middle, rarely widest towards the base, $(1.8-)1.97-3.3(-3.6) \times (0.42-)0.53-0.99(-1.1)$, average of 2.65 × 0.76, cm, (3-)3.18-3.95(-4.52), average of 3.56, times long as wide, base cuneate to attenuate, margin entire, apex rounded to emarginate; inflorescence hairs spreading glands to two, rarely to three, cells long (including gland); bracts widest towards the tip or the tip, occasionally widest near the middle, $(4.1-)4.36-8.02(-9.8) \times 1-2.23(-3)$, average of 6.19 × 1.61, mm, (3.27-)3.49-4.45(-5), average of 3.97, times long as wide, base cuneate to attenuate, margin entire, apex obtuse, occasionally $\pm 90^{\circ}$ or rounded, rarely acute or emarginate; fruiting calyx (5.3-)5.44-5.89(-5.9), average of 5.67, mm long; buds dark blue-purple, corolla dark blue or blue-purple to blue or blue-purple; anthers dark blue or blue-purple to blue or blue-purple; style bifid, the longer arm 2–4 times as long as the shorter; mature nutlets alveolate, (1.6-)1.61-1.77(-1.8), average of 1.69, mm long, hilum (0.4-)0.45-0.57(-0.6), average of 0.51, mm long, (0.25-)0.27-0.34(-0.35), average of 0.3, times the length of the nutlet alveoli small, ridges short to mid-sized (Figure 2g).

Phenology:—Flowers and fruits September to November.

Etymology:—The epithet *latens* (Latin, hidden or secret) is given to this species for two reasons. The first is for eluding the author's notice even after several years of intense study in this genus. Two sets of specimens, one from FLAS and one from NCU (and the only ones known to the author before he collected more in October 2021), were originally identified as *T. floridanum*, largely based on overall morphology and locality. Upon further morphological inspection, the author noticed differences in the FLAS specimen and assumed, erroneously, that it was an aberrant form of *T. floridanum*. This notion was abandoned later when the author reexamined the NCU collections (the designated types), which were from a different location and year than the FLAS specimen. A subsequent collecting trip allowed the author to revisit the collection sites, where he found both previously documented populations, one of which was growing in sympatry with *T. fruticosum*. There were no intermediate plants seen in the sympatric population. This collecting trip allowed these populations to be included in the genetic analyses that showed these plants were indeed distinct.

The second reason for the epithet *latens* is that, despite extensive field work by the author, no other populations of this species were found, meaning that the only populations known are the two collection sites. There are potentially more populations hidden elsewhere in this area of Florida that are waiting to be "found," for it is doubtful that the entirety of this species occurs in only two places on a six-mile stretch of highway.

The common name of Hidden Bluecurls is given to this species for the same reasons.

Habitat and distribution:—*Trichostema latens* occurs in coastal and near-coastal scrubby flatwoods; 0–5 meters; USA: Florida: Franklin County. (Figure 13)

Conservation status:—Only two populations of this species are known despite much searching. It seems to have a similar ecological preference to *Liatris provincialis* Godfrey, so it may have a similar range. Future floristic surveys in the area may turn up more populations. This species has an extremely limited range and the threat to one of the currently known populations' existence is extremely high since it is on a roadside. Based on the data collected for this study, this species should be recognized at a G1 ranking (NatureServe 2020).

Trichostema bridgesii-orzellii K.S. McClell., sp. nov. (Figure 14)

- **Diagnosis:**—Suffrutescent perennial to 1 m tall, morphologically most similar to *Trichostema suffrutescens*. It differs from *T. suffrutescens* by its larger size to 1 m tall (*vs.* to 60 cm tall), longer fruiting calyces of 5.20–6.14 mm (*vs.* 4.76–5.97 mm), and a geographic restriction to the southern Lake Wales Ridge (*vs.* a geographic restriction to the Trail, Mt. Dora, Orlando, and northern Lake Wales Ridges).
- Type:—U.S.A. Florida. Highlands County. Openings in scrub and sandy roadside. Robert Kevan Schoonover, II, Edwin Bridges, and Steve Orzell 120a-h (holotype NCU!; isotypes FLAS!, GH!, MO!, NCU!, NY!, US!, USF!). Note: Specimens Robert Kevan Schoonover, II 120a-h represent a single gathering in accordance with Article 8.2 of the ICN (Turland et al. 2018).

Suffrutescent perennial to 1 m tall; branching primarily in the lower to middle part of the plant; stem hairs downwardly curved to two, occasionally to three, cells long (Figure 1g), with sessile glands; node hairs downwardly curved, rarely spreading, to two, occasionally to three, cells long (Figure 1g); leaves widest towards the tip or near the middle, rarely widest towards the base, $(0.8-)1.16-1.82(-2.3) \times (0.28-)0.44-0.75(-1.04)$, average of 1.49×0.6 , cm, (1.53-)2.09-3.06(-4.67), average of 2.57, times long as wide, base cuneate to attenuate, margin entire, apex rounded to emarginate, rarely obtuse; inflorescence hairs spreading, occasionally downwardly curved, to two, occasionally to three, cells long, with sessile and spreading glands to two, rarely to three, cells long (including gland); bracts widest towards the tip, $(2.5-)3.41-5.32(-6.8) \times (0.7-)1.13-2(-3)$, average of 4.36×1.57 , mm, (1.79-)2.3-3.46(-4.63), average of 2.88, times long as wide, base cuneate to attenuate, margin entire, apex obtuse to actionally acute to $\pm 90^{\circ}$, rarely emarginate; fruiting calyx (4.1-)5.2-6.14(-7.3), average of 5.67, mm long; buds purple-black to dark blue-purple, corolla dark blue or blue-purple to blue or blue-purple; anthers dark blue or blue-purple to blue or blue-purple; style bifid, the longer arm 2.5-4.5, rarely as little as 2 or as much as 6, times as long as the shorter; mature nutlets alveolate, (1.4-)1.55-1.78(-1.9), average of 1.67, mm long, hilum (0.4-)0.55-0.73(-0.9), average of 0.64, mm long, (0.27-)0.34-0.43(-0.5), average of 0.38, times the length of the nutlet, alveoli small, ridges mid-sized, occasionally short, rarely tall (Figure 2h).

Phenology:—Flowers and fruits June to December. Some plants will have a small number of flowers February to May.

Etymology:—This species is named after Edwin L. Bridges and Steve L. Orzell, who not only provided much assistance in collecting data for this study and co-collected the type specimens, but who also have had a long and impactful career studying the ecology and floristics of Florida, particularly of fire-maintained habitats. Several of their studies have focused on the Bombing Range Ridge and southern Lake Wales Ridge where this species is endemic.

Their work has not only improved our understanding of the seasonality of fire and of fire ecology overall, but also has uncovered several new plant taxa that are Florida endemics. As such, it is fitting to name this species in their honor. The common name Bridge's and Orzell's Bluecurls is given to this species for the same reasons. The names of the two men "usually stand independently," so a hyphenated epithet with each name in the genitive is used (Turland *et al.* 2018).

Habitat and distribution:—*Trichostema bridgesii-orzellii* occurs in scrub and sandhills; 5–100 meters; USA: Florida: Lake, Highlands, Orange, Osceola, and Polk Counties. (Figure 15)

Conservation status:—Based on the data collected for this study, this species should be recognized at a G2 ranking (NatureServe 2020).

Notes:—This species is cryptic when compared to *T. suffrutescens* based solely on herbarium material. In the field it can be distinguished by its more robust size and the difference in the scent of its oils. Analysis of the volatile oils of these two species may help better define this difference, as has been done in the similarly distributed mint genus *Dicerandra* (McCormick *et al.* 1993). *Trichostema bridgesii-orzellii* occurs primarily on the Lake Wales and Bombing Range Ridges in Florida. The geographic split between this species and *T. suffrutescens* is unclear due to extensive habitat loss and the limitation which that imposed on sampling. Increased sampling of genetic and morphologic data from populations along the Lake Wales Ridge may help clarify the differences between these two taxa.

Trichostema gracile K. S. McClell. sp. nov. (Figures 16 and 17)

- **Diagnosis:**—Suffrutescent perennial to 60 cm tall, morphologically most similar to *Trichostema suffrutescens*. It differs from *T. suffrutescens* by branching regularly in the middle to upper part of the plant (*vs.* primarily near the base), its narrower leaves of 0.26–0.56 cm (*vs.* 1.13–1.74 cm), larger leaf length/width ratio of 3.87–7.08 (*vs.* 2.39–3.05), an ecological preference for mesic to scrubby flatwoods (*vs.* and ecological preference for scrub and scrub-sandhill ecotones), and a geographic restriction to xeric habitats off the main central ridge systems of Florida (*vs.* a geographic restriction to the main central ridge systems).

Suffrutescent perennial to 60 cm tall; branching primarily in the middle to upper part of the plant; stem hairs downwardly curved to two, occasionally to three, cells long (Figure 1h), with sessile glands; node hairs downwardly curved, occasionally spreading, to two, occasionally to three, cells long (Figure 1h); leaves widest towards the tip or

near the middle, rarely widest towards the base, $(1.3-)1.69-2.44(-3) \times (0.2-)0.26-0.56(-0.88)$, average of 2.06 × 0.41, cm, (2.5-)3.87-7.08(-9.6), average of 5.47, times long as wide, base cuneate to attenuate, margin entire, apex rounded, occasionally obtuse, rarely emarginate or $\pm 90^{\circ}$; inflorescence hairs spreading, occasionally upwardly curved, rarely downwardly curved, to three cells long, with sessile and spreading glands to two cells long (including gland); bracts widest towards the tip, rarely widest near the middle, $(2.5-)3.36-5.46(-6.7) \times (0.7-)0.83-1.64(-2.3)$, average of 4.41×1.24 , mm, (1.81-)2.86-4.63(-5.67), average of 3.74, times long as wide, base cuneate to attenuate, margin entire, apex acute to obtuse, occasionally rounded; fruiting calyx (4.4-)5.07-5.87(-6.3), average of 5.45, mm long; buds purple-black to dark blue-purple, corolla dark blue or blue-purple to blue or blue-purple; anthers dark blue or blue-purple to blue or blue-purple; style bifid, the longer arm 4-6, rarely as little as 3 or as much as 9, times as long as the shorter; mature nutlets alveolate, (1.4-)1.48-1.73(-1.9), average of 1.61, mm long, hilum (0.3-)0.42-0.61(-0.7), average of 0.52, mm long, (0.21-)0.27-0.37(-0.44), average of 0.32, times the length of the nutlet, alveoli small, rarely mid-sized, ridges tall, occasionally mid-sized (Figure 2i).

Phenology:—Flowers and fruits September to December. Some plants will have a small number of flowers March to April.

Etymology:—The epithet *gracile* (Latin: thin, slender) is given to this species based on its overall habit. It often has only one or a few erect stems whose short slender leaves give the plants a wand-like appearance, especially when vegetative. The common name Flatwoods Bluecurls is chosen for this species based on its ecological distribution.

Habitat and distribution:—*Trichostema gracile* occurs in mesic to scrubby flatwoods; 5–40 meters; USA: Florida: Brevard, Broward, Charlotte, Highlands, Hillsborough, Indian River, Lee, Manatee, Martin, Orange, Osceola, Palm Beach, Polk, Saint Lucie, Sarasota, Seminole, and Volusia Counties. (Figure 18)

Conservation status:—This species is quite widespread throughout the central and southern parts of the Florida Peninsula; however, the number of populations and their sizes are affected by its habitat requirements. Based on the data collected for this study, this species should be recognized at a G3 ranking (NatureServe 2020).




FIGURE 18. Approximate range of *Trichostema gracile* based on field data and herbarium records.

It differs from *T. suffrutescens* by its bushier (extensively and repeatedly branched) habit (*vs.* virgate), later flowering time of mid-October–mid-January (*vs.* August–early November), and a geographic restriction to the Jupiter Ridge (*vs.* a geographic restriction to the main central ridge systems).

Suffrutescent to bushy perennial to 60 cm tall; branching throughout the plant; stem hairs downwardly curved to two, rarely to three, cells long (Figure 1i), with sessile glands; node hairs downwardly curved, to two, rarely to three, cells long (Figure 1i); leaves widest towards the tip or near the middle, occasionally widest towards the base, $(0.99-)1.29-1.55(-1.7) \times (0.33-)0.45-0.6(-0.69)$, average of 1.42×0.53 , cm, (2.03-)2.46-2.98(-3.33), average of 2.72, times long as wide, base cuneate to attenuate, margin entire, apex rounded, rarely emarginate; inflorescence hairs spreading to downwardly curved, rarely upwardly curved, to two, rarely to three, cells long, with sessile and spreading glands to two cells long (including gland); bracts widest towards the tip, $(2.5-)3.49-4.89(-5.5) \times (0.7-)1.17-1.73(-2)$, average of 4.19×1.45 , mm, (1.67-)2.34-3.61(-4.58), average of 2.97, times long as wide, base cuneate to attenuate, margin entire, apex rounded, rarely acute to $\pm 90^{\circ}$; fruiting calyx (4.8-)4.85-5.45(-5.9), average of 5.15, mm long; buds purple-black to dark blue-purple, corolla dark blue or blue-purple to blue or blue-purple; style bifd, the longer arm 2.5-3.5, rarely as little as 2, times as long as the shorter; mature nutlets alveolate, (1.5-)1.53-1.68(-1.8), average of 1.6, mm long, hilum (0.5-)0.56-0.71(-0.8), average of 0.63, mm long, (0.29-)0.34-0.45(-0.47), average of 0.4, times the length of the nutlet alveoli small, ridges mid-sized to short (Figure 2j).

Phenology:—Flowers and fruits October to January. Some plants will have a small number of flowers in the spring.

Etymology:—The epithet *hobe* [pronounced hoe-BAY] is given to this species for the anglicized place names Hobe [pronounced like robe] Mountain, Hobe Sound, and the village Jobé of the Jeaga, and later the Jobé Indians that inhabited the area of Martin County, Florida (Wheeler & Pepe 2002), where it is endemic. In fact, one can see nearly the entirety of the known range of this species from the summit of Hobe Mountain (personal observation). This epithet is a noun derived from the Latinization of the name for the indigenous peoples of the area and stands in apposition to the genus name, which is why it is not declined. The common name Jobé Bluecurls is given to this species for the same reasons.




FIGURE 21. Approximate range of *Trichostema hobe* based on field data and herbarium records. This species is only known to occur in Martin County, Florida.

Conservation status:—This species has an extremely narrow range, only occurring in the strip of scrub along the part of the Indian River called Hobe Sound in Martin County, from Seabranch State Preserve in the north to Jonathan Dickinson State Park in the south. It potentially also occurs in Palm Beach County in the Jupiter area, specifically the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse Outstanding Natural Area, and the scrub preserves along the Jupiter Ridge to the south, but this has not been verified. The known populations are quite large for this genus, numbering in the many hundreds in some cases. Based on the data collected for this study, this species should be recognized at a G2 ranking (NatureServe 2020).

Diagnosis:—Virgate perennial to 60 cm tall, morphologically most similar to *Trichostema suffrutescens*. It differs from *T. suffrutescens* by its narrower leaves of 0.28–0.42 cm (*vs.* 1.13–1.74 cm), presence of spreading trichomes on the stem and at nodes (*vs.* downwardly curved), and a geographic restriction to the Brooksville Ridge and sandhill and scrub habitats to the west (*vs.* a geographic restriction to the Trail, Mt. Dora, Orlando, and northern Lake Wales Ridges).




FIGURE 24. Approximate range of Trichostema microphyllum based on field data and herbarium records.

Suffrutescent perennial to 60 cm tall; branching primarily in the lower to middle part of the plant; stem hairs spreading, occasionally upwardly curved, rarely downwardly curved to three cells long (Figure 1j), with sessile glands; node hairs spreading to upwardly curved, to three cells long (Figure 1j); leaves widest towards the tip, $1.1-1.49(-1.9) \times (0.24-)0.28-0.42(-0.54)$, average of 1.28×0.35 , cm, (3-)3.2-4.31(-5.42), average of 3.76, times long as wide, base cuneate to attenuate, margin entire, apex rounded, rarely obtuse to acute or emarginate; inflorescence hairs spreading to upwardly curved, to three, rarely to four, cells long, with sessile and spreading glands to two cells long (including gland); bracts widest towards the tip, $(2.8-)3.58-5.18(-6.4) \times (0.5-)0.9-1.61(-1.9)$, average of 4.38×1.25 , mm, (2.56-)2.7-4.77(-5.82), average of 3.73, times long as wide, base cuneate to attenuate, margin entire, apex rounded, rarely obtuse to acute or emarginate; fruiting calyx (5-)5.19-5.94(-6.3), average of 5.56, mm long; buds purple-black to dark blue-purple, corolla dark blue or blue-purple to blue or blue-purple; anthers dark blue or blue-purple to bl

Phenology:—Flowers and fruits September to November.

Etymology:—The epithet *microphyllum* (*micro*: Latin, small; *phyll*: Latin, leaf) is given to this species since it has the smallest leaves by leaf area of any *Trichostema*. The common name Small-leaved Bluecurls is given to this species for the same reason.

Habitat and distribution:—*Trichostema microphyllum* occurs in sandhills and sandhill-scrub ecotones; 10—100 meters; USA: Florida: Alachua, Citrus, Hernando, Levy, Marion, and Pasco Counties. (Figure 24)

Conservation status:—This species is restricted to the Brooksville Ridge and xeric habitats to the west. While the full extent of its range is possible to predict, how common it is in this range has been difficult to determine. The Citrus and Croom tracts of Withlacoochee State Forest represent the largest and highest quality habitats for this species and most observations of this species have been from these two properties. Based on the data collected for this study, this species should be recognized at a G2 ranking (NatureServe 2020).
